Of Fisheries, Inland Division, to express the need for more containment for hatching and growing trout at McGowan's.' 31.05.16-02	<p>Action Required from Environmental Committee Report – Fish were released from the Charleston hatchery into Wentworth and Salters Brooks. Some trout were able to free themselves from the incubation boxes and found a home in the waterway around the hatchery; otherwise, minimal loss was sustained. Fish have been released from 3 schools involved in the Fish Friend program. The Jr. High is the only remaining school to release the fish. Ronnie received a card from Greenfield School thanking him, Dell and the Association for the program. The Fish Friend program will continue next year. Eggs will be ordered again this fall for the hatchery. There is enough room to increase the number of eggs at the hatchery by installing 3 more incubators, each having 3 layers within the incubator.</p> <p>DFO have slated a meeting for 7 June in Truro. Ronnie was invited to speak on the Fish Friend program. He has indicated that there is a small chance he may attend but it is very unlikely.</p> <p>Ronnie will coordinate a meeting with the Environmental Committee. 20.12.16-02	<p>Action required from Environmental Committee Report – 7/8 members assisted in the annual adipose fin clipping at McGowan’s this fall. 12,000-14,000 fish were clipped. MRSA was the only organization assisting in this task, along with McGowan employees. Needing to reduce their stock McGown gave 15,000 trout to MRSA for release into the Medway. These were dispersed into a number of brooks. Due to labour strife between the Gov. and NSTU the Fish Friend program is in limbo. Teachers are working to rule, therefore, will not assume responsibility for the aquariums. Ronnie indicated the need to purchase ammonia, filters, etc. for the maintenance of the aquariums. If the program goes ahead this year start up will be 1st – 2nd week of February. McGown’s will provide about 350 eggs for the various schools.</p> <p>What can be done regarding the number of seals in our harbours and bays? Michael will send thank you letters to: Dennis Alexander for building a number of incubation boxes for the Charleston hatchery; and to Freeman Lumber for the materials supplied for repairs to the hatchery.</p> <p>The question arose as to whether MRSA should be asking for more trout from McGowans...response: 'although we would accept more fish McGown’s have a responsibility to other river organizations as well.'
